## PMI - LOS ANGELES CHAPTER, INC.

PMI is the leading global association for the project management profession. PMI sets industry standards, conducts research and provides education, certification and professional exchange opportunities designed to strengthen and further establish the profession. PMI advances the careers of practitioners, while enhancing overall business and government performance, through documentation of return on investment. PMI has over 700.000 members and more than 1.4 million PMPs (Project Management Professional certification) in over 300 chapters. Within Los Angeles, there are over 2,400 PMI Chapter Members and more than 1,200 PMPs. (April 2024).

During the early years of PMI, there were no chapters; the organization existed as one body with individual members. The local chapter concept was eventually introduced, and a unit consisting of all California members was formed. This California chapter alternated holding its meetings in San Francisco and Los Angeles, drawing participation throughout the state. However, the travel and logistics soon proved impractical; and separate chapters were eventually formed in each location. The Southern California Chapter was formed from those PMI members south of Bakersfield. Monthly meetings were held, which drew attendees from this vast area, and a charter was issued to this Southern California Chapter in 1974.

By 1986, the number of members in the San Diego area was large enough to charter a separate chapter, the San Diego Chapter, to serve that area.

Meantime, PMI interest and membership continued to grow in the Southern California Chapter, and eventually, the membership in the Orange County area was sufficient to support a new chapter there as well. With the formation of the Orange County Chapter in 1989, the name of the Southern California Chapter was changed to the Los Angeles Chapter; and in 1999, the PMI-LA chapter received recognition for its 25th year in operation. However, the geographical territory of the chapter was still too large to allow us to adequately serve our members in all our area. So, in 2000, still another chapter, the Los Padres Chapter (now known as PMI-California Central Coast Chapter), was formed which consisted of members in the Santa Barbara and Ventura area.


The PMI California Chapter divided into Northern and Southern branches, a significant evolution in the organization's structure, moving from three US chapters to four.




Introduced the PMI-LA Project of the Year Program with the Alameda Corridor Project, hosted a fun event at Dodger Stadium, and supported a regional program financially.

Celebrated a 30-year milestone, updated bylaws to one-year presidential terms, and the C-17 Project won Project of the Year. 2004





## FIRST CHAPTERS



In early 1974, 3 Chapters were formed. PMI-California, PMI-New York, and PMI-Houston. PMI-California had 24 members, alternating meetings between North & South. By June of that same year, the chapter had enough members in each location to dissolve and become re-chartered as PMI- Northern California and PMI-Southern California.

In 1989, PMI-Southern California Chapter was re-branded as PMI- Los Angeles Chapter. PMI-Northern California Chapter was rebranded as PMI-San Francisco Bay Area Chapter.

PMI-New York—it is believed that PMI-New York had a similar situation and was dissolved to become several chapters.

PMI-Houston is the oldest originally chartered chapter in PMI, celebrating its Milestone 6 months earlier than the California chapters.

Ida Harding was instrumental in forming a chapter advocate program at the Global level. A volunteer position with no budget, local chapters rallied to support their regional advocate. At the time PMI-Los Angeles was a part of Region III.

The title then changed to Component Mentor and finally to Region 7 Mentor in 2009. Now PMI provides a small travel budget to region mentors in order to support their areas. Region 7 consists of all Southwestern US—with California as the largest with 11 chapters. Other states included are Nevada(2), Arizona(2), New Mexico(1) and Hawaii (1) which make up a total of 17 chapters in Region 7.


