- Pre-disaster response planning
- · Pre-disaster recovery planning
- Mitigation planning & implementation
- · Community capacity building
- · Partnership building
- Planning for continuation of services and support for residents during and after disaster

- · Provide emergency shelter & housing
- Provide emergency medical / mental health care, & financial assistance
- Clear debris from & reopen primary transportation routes
- Establish interim infrastructure to support business re-openings & cash flow
- Assess and understand risk and vulnerabilities to mitigate additional damage

- Provide accessible interim housing solutions
- · Initiate large-scale debris removal
- Plan immediate infrastructure repair & restoration
- Support reestablishment of businesses
- Engage & support mental/behavioral health support networks providing ongoing care to impacted people
- Ensure continuity of care via temporary accessible public health facilities
- Inform residents re: opportunities and resources for building back stronger

- Develop permanent housing solutions
- Restore & rebuild infrastructure to meet current & future community needs
- Implement economic revitalization strategies
- · Facilitate funding to business rebuilding
- Support & help residents connect with ongoing counseling, behavioral health, & case management services
- Reestablishment of disrupted health care facilities
- Implement mitigation strategies & projects
